Learning through Investigations

We have been investigating FEELINGS.

We all experience lots of different feelings. Some of these can be uncomfortable feelings, whilst others are comfortable feelings.

In Years 1-2 we have been investigating FEELINGS (emotions). It is important that we notice what we are feeling and start to understand how we can manage feelings that we do not like (uncomfortable feelings).



Our investigations have included tactile experiences, drawing and even acting.
You can see our acting expressions on the next page.



Can you match the expressions and the body language with the feeling words?

Remember the children are acting.

There may be two or more words that match an expression and there may be more than one picture to match a word. The important thing is to recognise that we all experience a lot of different emotions and that some of these are comfortable feelings, whilst others can be uncomfortable.

Start noticing the changes in your feelings (emotions).



Some FEELING words:

***happy, impressed, cosy, friendly, love, excited, caring,
warm, snugly, proud, sad, scared, sulky, concerned, sorry,
worried, frustrated, annoyed, lonely, fear, angry, surprised***
