Respectful Behaviours Within Our School Community

When parents, carers and school staff work together as one team, our students do better. Everyone at school, particularly staff and parents/carers, play a role in making school a better place for learning and work. Parents, carers and school staff have a relationship that can last many years. This is an opportunity to work together to create a positive relationship in the best interests of the child. When this relationship is built on respect and trust, students learn better and feel like they belong in the school.

Every member of our school community has a right to feel safe and be protected.

The Department of Education and Training has released the <u>Respectful Behaviours within the School Community Policy</u> that describes the positive behaviour expected from parents, carers, and other adults in Victorian school communities. The policy sets clear standards of behaviour to create a safe, respectful, and inclusive learning environment for students, staff and adults.

There are also resources to support safe and respectful relationships in our school community, including information about getting involved in the school, advice on how to raise a concern or complaint, and parenting support resources. You can find the new policy and these resources <u>here</u> You may also see a new poster up around our school, promoting positive behaviour.

NAPLAN

Our Year 3 and 5 children will be sitting the NAPLAN Assessments over the next two weeks. This is now an earlier time in the school year. Please communicate with your children that this is only one single test in time and all we ask is that they try their best. We are very proud of the children as they always try their best. Please aim to have your children attend school each day during this period to avoid them having to do catch up testing which can be stressful for them.

School Attendance

Whilst we do not expect children to attend school if unwell or if there is a family emergency we want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day.

If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school.

There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes.

Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading. Being away from school for one day a fortnight equals missing 1.5 years over 13 years of schooling.

It is also extremely important that children are not leaving early in the school day.

Being COVID-Safe

On October 12th 2022 the Victorian Government announced that the mandatory orders around isolation for people with COVID-19 have ended and instead we move to health advice and recommendations for people with COVID-19 or COVID-19-like symptoms.

Our school will continue to adhere to the Department of Health's recommendations to ensure that our school remains a safe environment for our staff and students.

The Department of Health **strongly recommends** that students and school staff:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days and do not attend school after 5 days if they are still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive not attend school. This does not include students with pre-existing conditions such as hay fever.

Parents and carers are recommended to continue to report their child having COVID-19 to both the school and the Department of Health.

We will, however, no longer report occurrences of positive cases to the school community.

We ask parents and carers to continue to remain vigilant in preventing COVID-19 transmission. Any student who is unwell should continue to remain at home. This is about keeping students healthy and well in our school and reducing the spread of both COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases.

Rapid Antigen Tests are available for all Victorians from Council sites. People can get 2 free packs (10 tests) for themselves and 2 free packs (10 tests) for each of their household members.

People with disability and their carers can get up to 4 free packs (20 tests) in line with existing RAT distribution for people with disability.

Parents and carers will be contacted if their child shows symptoms while at school.

Students who wish to wear a mask should continue to do so.

To keep our school as safe as possible, we will also continue to use air purifiers and other COVID-19 prevention measures.

We appreciate and thank you for your continued efforts to keep our school community safe and well.

Welfare Corner

Supporting your child with NAPLAN

Our Year 3 & 5 students will soon be undertaking NAPLAN.

For some students this can cause a level of stress and anxiety.

Here are some steps that parents / carers can do to help prepare your child/ren for NAPLAN:

- Be mindful that how you talk about NAPLAN can influence how your child feels about the NAPLAN test.
- At Bell Park North Primary School, we just ask to children to do their best, they do not have to be the best. Encourage them to do the best they can.
- The routine in the morning before the NAPLAN test is important, try to keep the routine calm and relaxed.
 Make sure you get your child to school in plenty of time, so they have time to bring their bags etc. in and settle before the test.
- Ensure they get to bed at a reasonable time so they get enough sleep to be able to concentrate. Remember, school aged children need between 9 -11 hours of sleep www.sleephealthfoundation.org.au/factsheets-a-z/203-sleep-needs-across-the-lifespan.html
- A good, healthy breakfast is important as this assists their brain to function at maximum capacity. We all need to feed our brain https://www.healthdirect.gov.au/healthy-eating-for-children
- It is normal to feel a little nervous before tests. Feeling a bit nervous can actually help people to do better in tests. Nervousness usually goes away when we take a few deep breaths and begin the test

Here are some relaxation strategies; you can encourage your child to do:

- Take some deep breaths in and then release your breath slowing.
- Think positive thoughts. Encourage your child to use positive self-talk, that they can do the test.
- Encourage your child to do some stretching to relax muscles.
- Have a talk with your child about how they are feeling, get them to write or draw their feelings

I wish all of our Year 3 & 5 students all the best for NAPLAN. If you are concerned about the level of stress your child is experiencing, please talk to your child's teacher or let me know. We are here to support.


When making additional bookings, the \$10.00 fee is eligible for the Child Care Subsidy, which means you may only need to pay the gap, depending on your families' circumstances.

Lions Village Licola aims to provide challenging and enjoyable experiences for all.

Our leaders and staff are well trained, enthusiastic and imaginative, providing a safe and supervised environment based on the principles of respect, responsibility, care and honesty.

We create a spirit of teamwork and cooperation. It is our aim to challenge participants & encourage them to exceed their expectations by organising and conducting safe and rewarding activities. We encourage participants to have respect for themselves and others. Camps focus on promoting a feeling of self worth in those who feel they have little or none, encouraging them to rise to their potential.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE:
