#### **Reminders**

#### Children Leaving Early

Iust a reminder to all that children should only be leaving school early for very important reasons. Please try and make appointments out of school times so that learning time is not lost. Children who have siblings in Foundation should not be leaving at 2:30pm with them. They must stay at school until 3:10p.m.

Children in Years 1-6 who leave at 2:30pm because their Foundation sibling does will not have their absence approved.

We also ask that parents who are going to pick up their children early ring ahead to let us know so we can get your child ready. This minimises the disruptions to the classroom.

Your understanding and support around these practices is much appreciated.



#### Mobile Phone Policy

In accordance with the Department's <u>Mobile Phones Policy</u> issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Bell Park North Primary School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical and responsible manner.

#### Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Bell Park North Primary School are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Bell Park North Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items, where students bring a mobile phone to school, Bell Park North Primary School will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so.

At Bell Park North Primary School students are required to hand in their mobile phones to the school administration office to be placed in a lockable safe.

#### Enforcement

Students who use their personal mobile phones and other personal mobile devices inappropriately at Bell Park North Primary School may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing Engagement and Wellbeing and/or Anti-Bullying and Harassment and/or Digital Technologies eSmart and/or Digital Technologies Acceptable Use Agreement policies.

At Bell Park North Primary School inappropriate use of mobile phones and other personal mobile devices is **any use during school hours**, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing or threatening messages or phone calls
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers and members of the school community without their permission
- to capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms
- during tests and assessments

We look forward to this and well done to all the children who get to participate. For those who don't the term starts fresh next term so term so keep trying.

#### Early Dismissal On Friday

Just a reminder that **school finishes at 2:10p.m. on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> April (last day of Term 1)** I urge all parents to ensure they are here on time to collect children as teachers are only on duty until 2:25p.m. After this time there will not be any staff at school to supervise any children who may not have been collected.

\*Bell Park North staff will be manning the three main crossings used by our children.





#### Easter Hat Parade

An Easter Hat Parade will be held on **Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> April at 9:00 a.m.** in our school gymnasium. Parents are welcome to attend. Children in all grades from F-6 will be participating.

#### Geelong Community Foundation Back To School Program

Once again this year the Geelong Community Foundation and various partners have provided our school with a number of Target Back to School Vouchers which we were able to distribute to families we assessed as in need. These cards have been used to assist families in purchasing school related items. Whilst we would greatly like to provide all families with vouchers this is not possible. We acknowledge the foundation and their support of those in need.

I extend an extremely big thank you to this foundation and their associated partners for the support and difference they are making to many.

#### STOPIT Service

STOPIT is a new Victoria Police text notification service enabling commuters, including school students, to report any form of inappropriate behaviour that makes them feel uncomfortable, frightened or threatened on the public transport network.

The STOPIT service enables commuters to use their mobile phone to promptly, easily and discreetly report inappropriate behaviours.

To use the service, commuters simply text 'STOPIT' to 0499 455 455. This triggers an automated response that includes a link to where the commuter can provide more details about what's just happened.

When people report these types of inappropriate behaviours, police can investigate and identify offenders to improve safety on public transport for everyone.

Parents and carers are encouraged to consider discussing the new service with students who travel on public transport. Students who use mobile phones outside of school hours are encouraged to save the STOPIT number in their mobile phone. Please note, STOPIT is for reporting non-urgent incidents on public transport. Always phone 000 in an emergency. For more information, refer to sexual and anti-social behaviour on public transport on the Victoria Police website.

#### SCHOOL

#### <u>Being COVID-Safe</u>

On October 12<sup>th</sup> 2022 the Victorian Government announced that the mandatory orders around isolation for people with COVID-19 have ended and instead we move to health advice and recommendations for people with COVID-19 or COVID-19-like symptoms.

Our school will continue to adhere to the Department of Health's recommendations to ensure that our school remains a safe environment for our staff and students.

The Department of Health strongly recommends that students and school staff:

- who test positive to COVID-19 stay home and isolate for 5 days and do not attend school after 5 days if they are still symptomatic
- who are symptomatic but have not tested positive not attend school. This does not include students with pre-existing conditions such as hay fever.

Parents and carers are recommended to continue to report their child having COVID-19 to both the school and the Department of Health.

We will, however, no longer report occurrences of positive cases to the school community.

We ask parents and carers to continue to remain vigilant in preventing COVID-19 transmission. Any student who is unwell should continue to remain at home. This is about keeping students healthy and well in our school and reducing the spread of both COVID-19 and other respiratory diseases.



**Rapid Antigen Tests are available for all Victorians from Council sites.** People can get 2 free packs (10 tests) for themselves and 2 free packs (10 tests) for each of their household members. People with disability and their carers can get up to 4 free packs (20 tests) in line with existing RAT distribution for people with disability.

Parents and carers will be contacted if their child shows symptoms while at school. Students who wish to wear a mask should continue to do so. To keep our school as safe as possible, we will also continue to use air purifiers and other COVID-19 prevention measures.

We appreciate and thank you for your continued efforts to keep our school community safe and well.

Our 5/6 students were lucky enough to make bouncy balls in Science, design artwork in Visual Arts and even make nachos in Food Technology.

We have been visited by Kevin and Pauline for Robotics where we were challenged to design a robot capable of digging up vegetables in a farm. The students did an amazing job creating robots which moved.

We've been very active having competed in three Lightning Premiership carnivals for cricket, volleyball and basketball. It was pleasing to see so many cooperative and supportive team members helping each other throughout these events.

Last of all, our 9 day swimming program was keenly attended by many students in Grade 5/6. There was some clear improvement in the students' confidence in the water and learned swimming strokes.















## **Bully Zero**

We have just completed our Bully Zero sessions at school, with the children's sessions on Friday March 17<sup>th</sup> and then a staff session on Monday March 20<sup>th</sup> in the afternoon and a parent session on Monday evening.

Bullying is a genuine issue, which cannot be ignored, bullying can end a life. We must all work together to stop bullying.

This is some of the information from the Bully Zero sessions:

Australian Bureau of Statistics states that one in four children are affected by bullying.

Bullied children are three times more likely to show depressive symptoms.

#### What is Bullying? Bullying definition from Bully Zero

'Bullying is repeated on going negative behaviour that is directed at an individual or a group with the intention to hurt or harm' (Bully Zero)

**Types of Bullying?** 

Cyber

Physical

Verbal

Social

Bullying is not:

- a single incident,
- disliking someone,
- accidental physical harm,
- being 'bossy,'
- arguments,
- telling a joke about someone once
- not hanging out with someone or choosing different people or groups to hang out with
- choosing not to participate in online games or group chats.
- bad moods encourage self-awareness.

#### Warning signs that your child may be, being bullied:

- More secretive about who they are talking to online or offline.
- Feeling worried, anxious, or scared
- Physical symptoms: unexplained headaches and stomach aches
- Low self-esteem
- Appetite changes
- Emotional mood changes
- School refusal or creating reasons why to stay home.
- Spending sizeable portions of time alone and withdrawing from family, friends, and social situations.

#### What to do if your child is being bullied

- Stay calm.
- Talk to your child communication is the key.
- Listen to what your child is telling you.
- Speak to the classroom teacher, it is important to let us know, so we can support your child.
- Develop an Action Plan 4 R's
- Remain calm don't give a reaction.
- Record date, time, incident, and witnesses
- Report help your child to build a safety net, five people that your child feels safe with that can offer support.
- Refer tell us at school.




